Parenting Rooms

Clare has two parenting spaces in the township which are available for community use. There is one in the Clare Library, Old North Road (library hours are Tuesday-Friday 10am-6pm and Saturday 10am-1pm) and another in the Clare Town Hall foyer, open Monday-Friday 9am-5pm.

Speed limit proposed changes - Armagh

Council has received several requests in relation to a speed limit change on Benbournie Road and Kurrang Avenue, Armagh where there is currently no speed limit signage. It is suggested that a speed limit of 50km/h be implemented from Blyth Road to the intersection of McRae Wood Road, then 80km to the end of the seal on Benbournie Road which would reduce risk to residents and road users. Speed limit proposed changes - Watervale

Council has been contacted by Watervale residents with concerns about the speed of many motorists entering the town via Popes Hill Road. Popes Hill Road flows into St Vincent Road, which is the main route through the Watervale township for accessing the primary School, Clare High School bus stop and general store/post office. There are no made footpaths in St Vincent Street and pedestrians use the roadway edge to walk and/or ride bikes. It is suggested the 50km speed sign be moved to the western side of the Riesling Trail, which would encourage road users to reduce their speed on the descent into Watervale, providing a safer environment for all residents of Watervale, visitors and Riesling Trail users.
