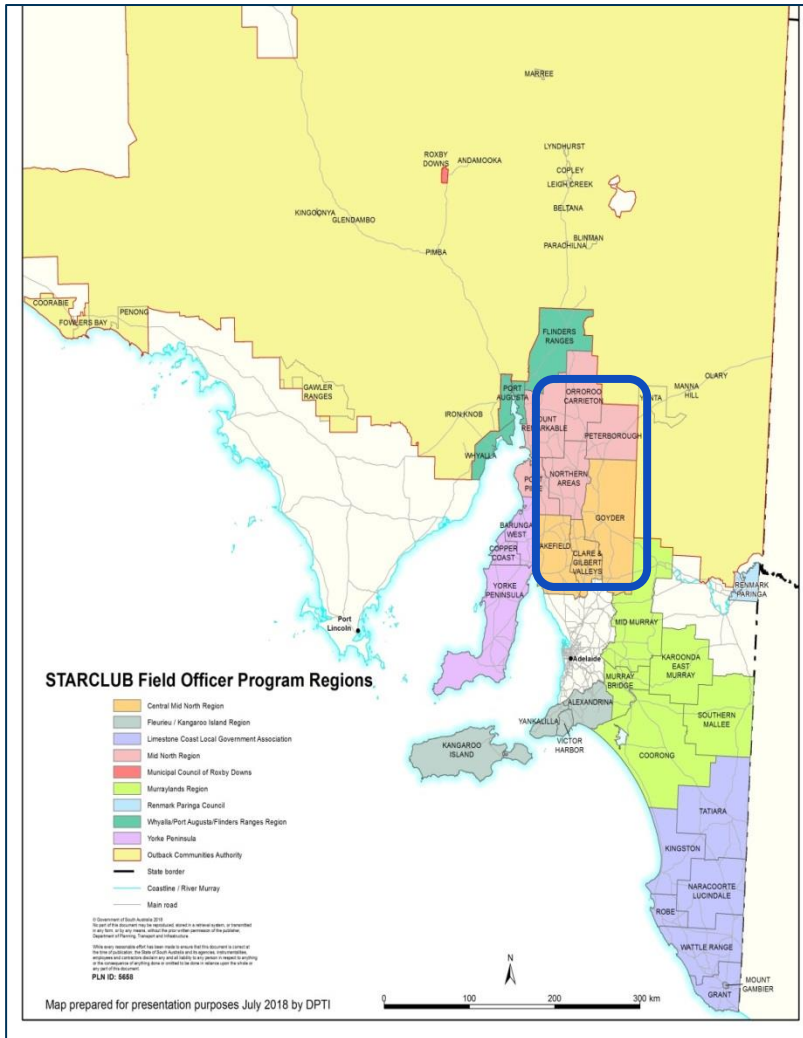

The Central Mid-North STARCLUB program is a joint funding venture between with the Office for Recreation, Sport & Racing (ORSR) and the three council regions of:

- Regional Council of Goyder- Main desk.3 days/ week
- Wakefield Regional Council- Hot desk-1 day/ week
- Clare & Gilbert Valleys Council- Hot desk.1 day/ week

THE FOCUS OF THE ROLE:

- to work with individual councils
- Aim to increase collaboration between councils on projects and with funding alignment and opportunities
- Gain a Regional perspective

What is the STARCLUB Program?




- Office for Recreation, Sport and Racing benchmark for a 'WELL-RUN' sport or recreation club in SA.
- Simple to use ONLINE club development tool launched July 2010.
- 25 questions with 5 key areas of club development
- Help clubs be the best they can be to meet their legal and affiliate requirements, with resources at hand.
- Can positively change a club culture and help grow membership
- STARCLUB web tool now has over 2000 registered club and recreation group users in SA.
- Four stages / levels of engagement with the program.

REGISTERED>SUBMITTED>PROVISIONAL>RECOGNISED

5 Key Areas- 25 questions

- Part 1 – Well Managed
 - Part 2 – Coaches & Officials
 - Part 3 – Volunteers Valued
 - Part 4 – Positive & Welcoming
 - Part 5 – Safe for All
- Not Compulsory
- Part 6 – Sustainability

To operate legally in SA all clubs must meet a minimum of the 5 criteria items listed- Incorporation; Risk Management; Volunteer/Staff inductions; Equal Opportunity principles; Child Safe Environments.

Part 1: WELL MANAGED	STATUS
1. Is our club incorporated or do we have an equivalent legal structure?	
2. **Do we have a risk management policy/OHSW policy for our club volunteers/staff?	
3. Is our club affiliated with our state or national body?	
4. Have we reviewed/updated our constitution & regulations (by-laws) in the past two to three years?	
5. Do we have a strategic document/plan for the next three to five years?	

Part 2: COACHES AND OFFICIALS	STATUS
6. Do we support our beginner coaches by providing information on available courses and resources?	
7. Does our club use accredited coaches, instructors and officials ?	
8. Do we provide codes of behaviour for all club coaches, instructors and officials to abide by?	
9. Are sideline trainers/First Aid officers present during our club training sessions and matches?	
10. Do we provide course and travel subsidies for coaches, instructors and officials?	

Part 3: VOLUNTEERS VALUED	STATUS
11. **Does our club provide its volunteers/staff with induction information ?	
12. Do we have a club volunteer/staff management policy in place?	
13. Does our club recognise and reward its volunteers/staff?	
14. Are young people encouraged to take up leadership roles in our club?	
15. Does our club have a succession plan ?	

Part 4: POSITIVE AND WELCOMING	STATUS
16. **Does our club comply with Equal Opportunity (EO) principles?	
17. Does our club treat people from all cultural backgrounds fairly and with respect?	
18. Do we monitor and manage the behaviour of our supporters and spectators ?	
19. Do we provide options for our members who may be experiencing hardship?	
20. Does our club have processes in place to deal with complaints or conflict ?	

Part 5: SAFE FOR ALL	STATUS
21. **Do we comply with our legal obligation to provide a child safe environment ?	
22. Have we appointed and trained a Child Safe Officer ?	
23. Does our club promote 'Play by the Rules' online training?	
24. Do we have a hot/extreme weather policy and do our members know about it?	
25. Do we promote a positive, drug and alcohol-free junior sport environment?

All questions answered online with YES, No or in Progress

Level 3 – Provisional Online Status Achieved- sufficient stage minimum requirement for ORSR grants

At least 3 questions in each part 1-5 must be answered YES, including all mandatory questions – Q 1,2, 11,16 & 21

Level 4 – Full STARCLUB Recognition Award- Best level for Grants

Request and complete STARCLUB Audit/Consultation to confirm all requirements have been met and all details are correct

Active Club Program

Provides assistance to active recreation and sport clubs with minor facilities, and programs and equipment.

Community Recreation and Sport Facilities Program

Provides assistance to eligible organisations to plan, establish or improve sport and active recreation facilities.

Grassroots Football, Cricket, and Netball Facility Program

Provides assistance to eligible applicants to increase participation and improving gender equity in Australian Rules Football, Cricket and Netball to support healthier, happier, and safer communities.

Planning and Research Program

Provides assistance to eligible organisations for planning and research initiatives that contribute to the delivery of facilities, programs and services that grow participation in active recreation and sport.

SASI Individual Athlete Program

Provides assistance to eligible elite and country athletes who are engaged in an Olympic, Paralympic or Commonwealth Games sport and event.

Sport and Recreation Development and Inclusion Program

Provides assistance to eligible organisations to develop and implement projects that will grow the sport or activity, improve services or address barriers to inclusion.

Sport and Recreation Sustainability Program

Provides assistance for the leadership, policies and services provided by South Australian state sport and active recreation organisations and industry representative bodies.

Vacswim SA Program

Provides assistance to eligible organisations to provide children aged 5 to 13 years old with opportunities to develop a range of water skills and positive experiences.
